**Dresser with Removable Drawers**

**New Knobs (optional)**

**Sherwin-Williams Emerald Interior Acrylic Latex**

**Paint Water + Detergent**

**Tack Cloth**

**Medium Grit 3M™ Sanding Sponge**

**Fine Grit 3M™ Sanding Sponge**

**Purdy Paint Roller Cover for Smooth Surfaces**

**Paint Roller Frame**

**Purdy Paint Brush (2")**

**Premium Wall & Wood Primer**

## Instructions:

1. First, select your dresser. We recommend one with drawers that fully remove, and a dresser body that frames each drawer to maximize color contrast.
2. Remove the knobs and clean the dresser with warm water and detergent. Once it's dry, sand the dresser and clean off dust with tack cloth.
3. Remove drawers and prime each one using Premium Wall & Wood Primer. Let dry 3-4 hours.
4. Once dry, paint each dresser drawer using a sponge or soft bristle brush. We picked one of favorite soft pinks, using Emerald® Interior Acrylic Latex Paint in Oleander SW 6603.
5. Slowly brush from the center of the face out to the edge.
6. Use another soft bristle brush, carefully paint the dresser frame and the legs of your dresser in this same color.
7. Replace your dresser drawers and screw back on the knobs to complete your new look.
